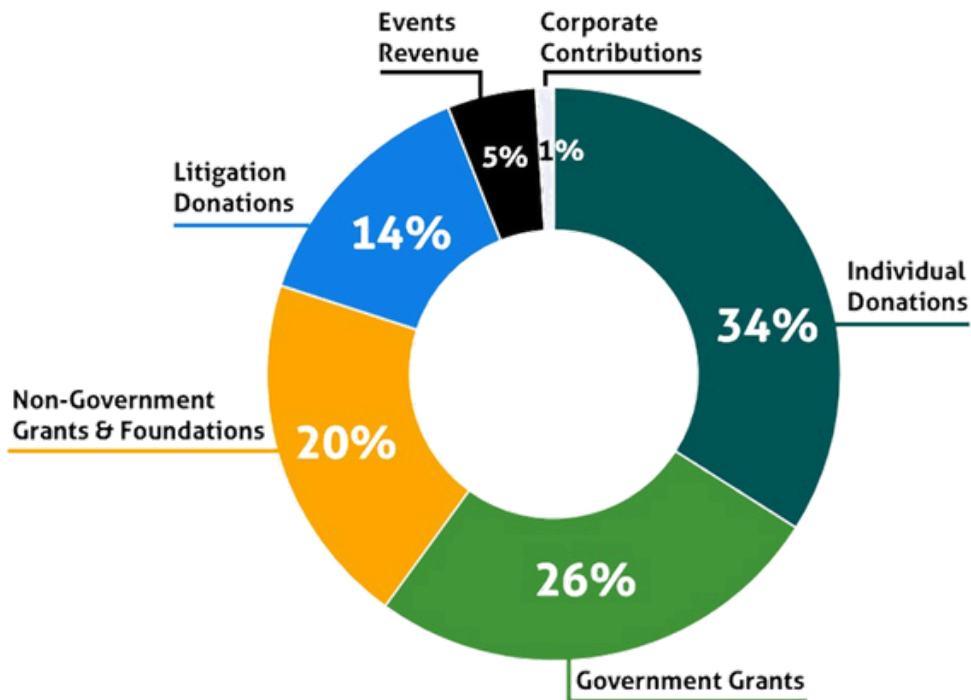

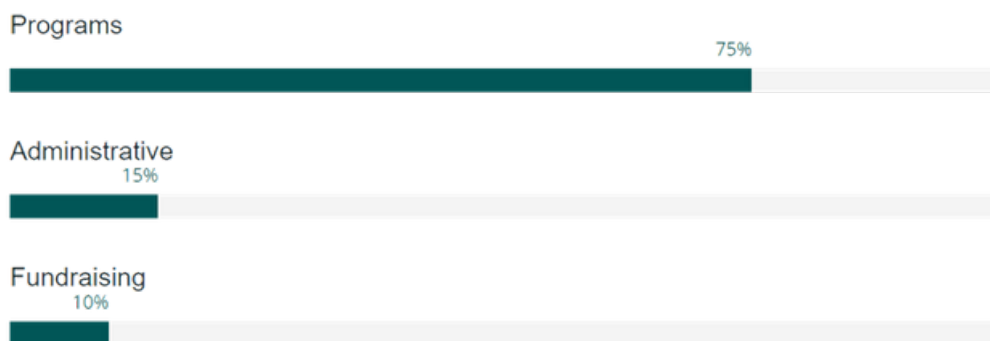

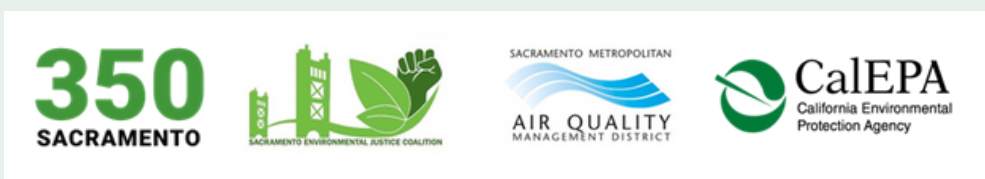

Distributed to 600 Households

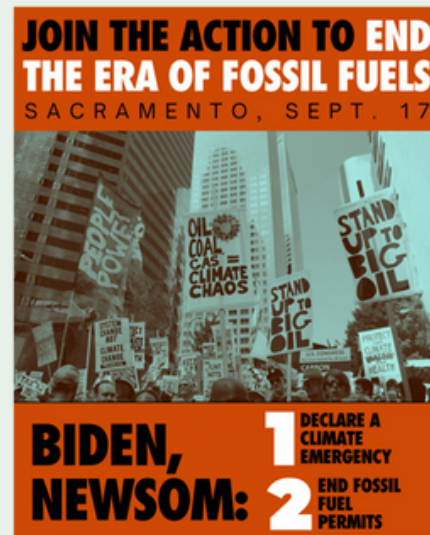
The air filter project – which included DIY construction workshops and community awareness events – brought air filters to more than 600 local households in areas that are most affected by pollution.

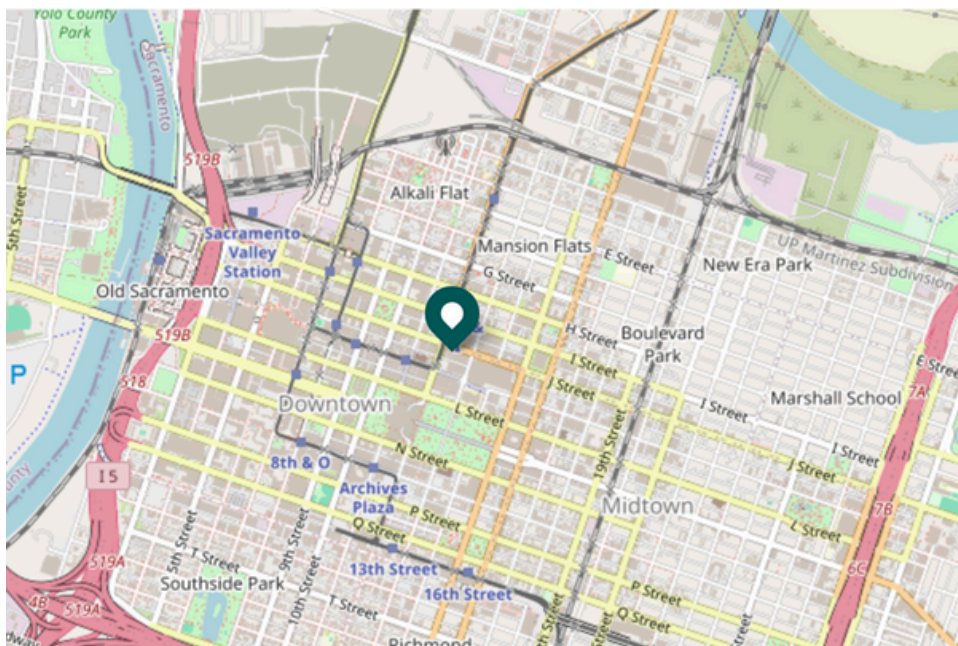
